Since 1995 Philip has been a Partner / Director in Lewis Partnership gaining considerable experience in the procurements of a variety of types of building projects including medical centres, community & educational facilities, social and private housing. Philip has been responsible for introducing computer-aided design and a Quality Management System to the Company. He has recently worked closely with the National Museums & Galleries of Wales at the Welsh Woollen Museum, Drefach, Velindre where great emphasis was placed in the use of sustainable materials and technologies during the Refurbishment Works.
